1. Admission Requirements

(1) Requirements to apply as a foreign student:

- I. Applicants must not hold ROC nationality as described in Article 2, of the ROC Nationality Act. Individuals originally holding ROC nationality, who have since renounced it, may not apply as foreign students, if less than eight years have elapsed since the ROC Ministry of the Interior revoked the applicant's ROC nationality. The eight years are calculated from the date of MOI revocation to the first day of the semester applied for.

※Article 2, Nationality Act of ROC:

A person shall have the nationality of the Republic of China under any of the conditions provided by the following subparagraphs:

- 1.His/Her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China when he/she was born.
- 2.He/She was born after the death of his/her father or mother, and his/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China at the time of death.
- 3.He/She was born in the territory of the Republic of China, and his/her parents can't be ascertained or both were stateless persons.
- 4.He/She has undergone the nationalization process.

Preceding subparagraph 1 and subparagraph 2 shall also apply to the persons who were

- minors at the time of the revision and promulgation of this Act.
- II. Applicants must not hold overseas Chinese status.
 - III. Applicants must not be nationals of Hong Kong, Macao, or the People's Republic of China.
 - IV. Applicants must not have been expelled from any university or college in ROC.
 - V. Applicants who graduated from a junior high school in ROC while registered as a foreign student may not apply to a bachelor degree program.
 - VI. Applicants recommended for study in the ROC by foreign governments, institutions, schools, cultural and educational organizations through bilateral agreements, are not subject to the restrictions listed in I and II.
- (2) Requirements to apply for courses of study:
 - I. For bachelor's program: high school diploma is required. For master's program: bachelor's diploma is required. For doctoral program: master's diploma is required. Diplomas must be issued by schools recognized by the ROC Ministry of Education.
 - II. If no diploma is held, students must hold equivalent qualifications for undergraduate or graduate study.
 - (3) Applicants must meet all individual departmental requirements.

2. Application Requirements

- (1) Applications must be received between February 1 and April 30, 2011. Applications received after April 30 will be processed for the next academic year.
- (2) Applications can be submitted either in person or via registered post.
- (3) Application forms should be submitted to National Chi Nan University / No.1 University Rd., Puli, Nantou County, Taiwan, 545-61, Republic of China.

3. Documents Required for Application

Submit the required documents in the order listed below, clipped or stapled together in the upper left hand corner. Applications will not be accepted if any of the following materials are missing. No submitted documents will be returned.

- (1) **Two copies of the application form** (A current personal photograph, head + shoulders shot without a hat or head covering, must be attached to each form)
 - (2) **One copy of the applicant's passport** (Unless specially authorized by the Ministry of Education, applicants for non-degree status must also provide a copy of their Alien Resident Certificate.)
 - (3) **One copy of the highest-level diploma** issued by an overseas education institution (these documents must be translated into Chinese or English), authenticated by an ROC overseas representative office.
 - (4) **One copy of the highest-level complete transcript** issued by an overseas education institution (these documents must be translated into Chinese or English), authenticated by an ROC overseas representative office.
- ※ Applicants who are admitted must submit the originals of the diploma and transcript authenticated by the ROC representative office when registering.
- (5) **Letters of recommendation:** letters must be sealed by the recommender. The number of letters required is stipulated by individual departments.
 - (6) **One study plan** written in Chinese or English (including an autobiographical statement)
 - (7) **One copy of a financial statement** certified by an ROC overseas representative office indicating sufficient funds for study in Taiwan.
 - (8) **Other documents as required by individual departments.**

5. Study Years

- (1) Bachelor program: Usually in a period of 4 years. Students may postpone graduation for 1-2 years. Some students may postpone graduation for practical training within half-2 years to meet the departments' requirement.

- (3) Ph.D. program: Within 2-7 years.

6. Important Regulations

- (1) All admission requirements and procedures are based on the regulations for Foreign Students Studying in the Republic of China issued by the Ministry of Education, Taiwan, Republic of China, on January 18, 2008.
- (2) The foreign academic certificate, complete transcript of record and validated financial statement submitted upon making an application for admission must be authenticated by a Taiwan's overseas representative office.
- (3) Overseas Chinese students who are not citizens of the Republic of China may apply for admission either as an "Overseas Chinese Student" or as an "International Student" based on their personal circumstances. Applicants must choose only one status. Applicants found to have applied using both statuses will have their acceptance and/or student status revoked.
- (4) Subject to school enrollment policies, the applicants specified below cannot be admitted to this university. Any violation of these policies will result in cancellation of the applicant's candidacy for admission.
 - I. applicants expelled from a degree-granting program at any university or college in the R.O.C.
 - II. applicants in a non-degree-granting program at this University who have had their student status revoked owing to violation of University regulations.
- (5) For applicants admitted, registration is limited to one department or graduate institute and one degree program at a time.
- (6) Those applicants not accepted will be notified by mail. No submitted documents or application fees will be returned.
- (7) Foreign students who have completed the courses applied for and desire to continue their education in Taiwan will follow the admission procedures for domestic students. Except that Foreign students having completed Bachelor's Degree or above in Taiwan and intending to proceed to apply for Master's Degree or above can offer applicant's diploma or credential of graduation from a Taiwan university or college and do not need to hand in one copy of the applicant's diploma or official credential of graduation from the highest school attended abroad. Those who had completed a Bachelor's Degree or above in NCNU with a diploma and a full official transcript from NCNU do not need to hand in one copy of the applicant's passport, the applicant's diploma, or an official credential of graduation from the highest school attended abroad, recommendation letters, a medical report and an

affidavit for financial support, however individual departments can decide whether or not an applicant has to hand in recommendation letters.

- (8) Any violation of academic honor or general laws or the submitting of falsified documents by the applicant will result in dismissal from the University after being admitted to NCNU. Should the violation be discovered after the applicant's graduation, the University will deprive him/her of his/her former student status and revoke his/her diploma.
- (9) Foreign students shall not apply for on-the-job Master, Evening Classes or Holiday Courses. Those having received Overseas Chinese residence Permit, perpetual residence permit, or applied for international courses approved by the Ministry of Education do not need to meet this requirement.

7. Dates and Places for Admission Interviews and Examinations

- (1) Date: May 3 ~ May 21, 2011 (decided by individual departments)
- (2) Review and Evaluation: Admission is based on the applicant's written documents and material submitted to the university. Some departments may require an interview, please refer to the individual department requirements. Applications are screened by an evaluation committee once a year. The evaluation process includes initial and final reviews. No documents can be returned, and the application fee is non-refundable.
- (3) Place: Location of any exam required by the individual department will be set by the departments concerned.

8. Admission Regulations

The final admission list is made by the Foreign Student Admissions Committee. The number of accepted students does not necessarily reach the number of admission stipulated by individual departments. After approval by the principal, applicants on the list will be notified by the Admission Section by mail. The Registration Section will notify students of enrollment details in the last 10 days of August.

9. Admission Roster Announcement

- (1) The final admission list will be announced on the bulletin board of NCNU in the 2nd week of June, 2011. It is also accessible on-line.
- (2) An admission letter will be mailed to the accepted students individually.

10. Appeals

Submit any complaints regarding application results to the NCNU Admission Section in black and white and with supporting evidence within 30 days after the release of the admissions list. Anonymous complaints will not be considered. (Find Appeal Form on page 35-36.)

11. Registration and Enrollment

- (1) All students accepted should register according to the instructions in the official notice of acceptance. Applicants who fail to complete these procedures will be considered to have declined acceptance. Documents required for registration include:
 - I. The original of applicant's passport
 - II. The original of the highest-level diploma, authenticated by an ROC overseas representative office.
 - III. The original of the highest-level complete transcript, authenticated by an ROC overseas representative office.

- IV. The original of the validated financial statement, authenticated by an ROC overseas representative office.
- V. Proof of medical insurance or National Health Insurance Program (Taiwan). Students with no insurance shall pay the insurance fee upon registration; NCNU will enroll students in an insurance plan.
- (2) When a foreign student admitted to NCNU arrives on campus before one-third of the first semester of the academic year has passed, they shall be considered enrolled for the semester. If they arrive at the campus after one-third of the first semester of the academic year has passed, they shall be considered as enrolled for the second semester.
- (3) Transferring credits from other universities is possible by application to the concerned department/institute. Credit transfer is evaluated based on the general policy of the University.
- (4) The Registration Section shall submit a list of all students on the final acceptance list who have enrolled on or before November 30, including their names, nationalities, year and department or institute admitted to, and clearly state if the applicant has won a Taiwan Scholarship or other scholarships sponsored by the Ministry of Education, for submission to the Ministry of Education.

National Chi-Nan University in Puli

Located in the West Pacific, the beautiful island of Taiwan was named “Formosa” by the Portuguese and “The Green Island” by the Taiwanese. Taiwan is an island situated between the tropical zone and the subtropical zone. With the weather like spring all year round, it is an area known for its plentiful agricultural products, diligent and enthusiastic people who have created numerous miracles including economic prosperity, democracy, diverse farm commodities and scientific and technological excellence, which have drawn wide attention worldwide.

There are 21 major cities in Taiwan. Nantou County is situated right in the middle of Taiwan and is the only hilly county not by the seashore. For a long time, Nantou has been known for its beautiful mountains and pure water. Nantou County is also the area that contains Taiwan’s highest mountain, Yushan, its longest river, the Choshui River, and its biggest high mountain lake, Sun Moon Lake. The fine weather and pure water contribute to the many beautiful nicknames of Puli such as “The Last Pure Land in Western Taiwan”, “The Backyard of Taichung”, “The Lotus Tower”, “Town of Butterflies”, “City of Flowers”, “Township of Cultural Center” and “The Treasure House of Anthropology”.

The general impression that people have about Puli is its wealth of talents and fertile farm products. In this small town, there are all kinds of cultural activities being held all year round such as traditional temple fairs, folk shows, cultural exhibitions, musical shows, and song and dance troupes. The internationally renowned Ju Percussion and Lin Hwai-min's Cloud Gate dance group have performed several times in Puli. Contributing to Puli’s economic prosperity are its plentiful resources of flowers and plants, water bamboo, passion fruit, Shaoxing wine, brown sugar cane, natural lacquer and hand-made calligraphy paper, for which Puli is world renowned. Puli also boasts the oldest Qie Dong tree, the largest Buddhist daochang, Chung Tai Chan Monastery, and one of the largest three insect museums in the world, Mu Sheng Insectarium. Many people consider it a blessing to live in Puli, lending to its international status as one of the finest cities in the world to live in.

National Chi Nan University is situated in the south-west mountainside of Puli. Occupying 150 hectares with graceful green landscapes, Chi Nan University is one of the prettiest universities in Taiwan. Built in the terrain of Tao Mi Li, a famous spot for ecotourism, the local area is diverse in its ecological resources, including diverse frogs and dragonflies. With all the cultural features of its hometown, Chi Nan University offers students a first class academic environment combined with a rich and diverse personal experience.

About NCNU

National Chi Nan University was founded on July 1st, 2005. It lies in Puli township, Nantou County, the center of the island of Taiwan and it's closed to Taiwan's beautiful scenic spot, Sun-Moon Lake. It is a tableland encompassing 150 hectares the tranquil campus is protected from outside disturbances. Amidst verdant hills and mountains, it commands a vast and entrancing view. The goal of our university is to fulfill the need for higher education, to balance regional development, to strengthen education for Overseas Chinese and to promote international interaction. NCNU now has established College of Humanities, College of Education, College of Management and College of Science & Technology, and we have about 420 full-time and part-time teachers and 5747 students. Besides Chinese and English, we open the information system and network introduction to make students really practice Internet in this common basic compulsory course of school, bbs, ms-office, etc. NCNU plans Southeast Asia Introduction and International Tendency course to reflect our school's Southeast Asia research feature and to cultivate students' service spirit, NCNU designs two-semester zero credit public service course as well. In order to help students to learn languages, and promote students' English and the Chinese level of oversea students, our school combines the synchronous technology of the multimedia, and develop "Chinese classroom of network multimedia" and promote efficiency and interest that students carry on network learning. Furthermore, NCNU cooperates with local resources to set up horsemanship, light boat and archery course in hope to enrich students' life.

We plan to be a comprehensive university with colleges of Humanities, Social, Education, Management, Technology, Biological Resources, establish an internationally renowned academic institute for Regional Studies on Southeast Asia, become a research and promotion center for advanced technology and cultivate the integration of multidisciplinary professionals and experts of Southeast Asian languages and overseas Chinese education.

Regulations Governing Foreign Student Admission, NCNU

Amended 2006/12

1. These regulations are established in accordance with Article 5 of the Ministry of Education's Regulations Governing Study by Foreign Students in the Republic of China and Article 6 of the Academic Regulations of National Chi Nan University.
2. These regulations govern foreign students applying to enroll in a degree-granting program, to take selected courses for credit.
3. Administrative procedures for foreign student applications shall be handled by the Foreign Student Enrollment Committee, which shall consist of the Dean of Academic Affairs, who will serve as a convenor, deans of the relevant colleges, and heads of the relevant departments. The Committee shall also appoint an executive secretary and acting secretary. These shall be recommended by the Dean of Academic Affairs from members of the Division of Academic Affairs for appointment by the President.
4. "Foreign Students" in these regulations shall mean students of foreign nationality, neither overseas Chinese nor ROC nationals. Those who have had ROC nationality formerly may not apply for admission based on these regulations until a period of eight years has passed after their ROC nationality has been revoked by the Ministry of the Interior. This period of eight years shall be determined until the date on which the semester begins at the school being applied for. Foreign citizens recommended to Taiwan for study by foreign governments, institutions, schools, cultural and educational organizations through bilateral agreement do not meet this regulation stipulated above may be accepted by the University.
5. The number of foreign students that NCNU accepts shall be limited to no more than ten percent of the number of ROC citizens admitted that year, and shall be reported to the Ministry of Education for ratification by November 30 each year.
Where the preceding paragraph refers to the number of foreign students recruited, the figure shall not include foreign students not enrolled in degree-granting programs.
6. Prerequisites for Application:
 - (1) Applicants must conform to requirements for admission to undergraduate or graduate study.
 - (2) Applicants who have been expelled by any university or college in the R.O.C. or who have been subject to the measures described in Article 14 of this Regulation will not be accepted.
 - (3) Language requirements for all applicants shall be set by individual departments, and determination of language skills shall be made at the preliminary review of the applicants by each departmentForeign students shall not apply for on-the-job Master, Evening Classes or Holiday Courses. Those having received Overseas Chinese Residence Permit, permanent residence permit, or applied for international courses approved by the Ministry of Education do not need to meet this requirement.
7. Applications should be sent to the Office of Admissions, Academic Affairs, National Chi Nan University, Puli 545-61, Taiwan, R.O.C. Applications should be received between February 1 and April 30. Applications received after April 30 will be processed for the next academic year. A complete application must include the following:
 - (1) Two copies of the applicant's completed application forms: a current personal photo must be attached to each form (2 inch bust photo without hat or head covering)
 - (2) One copy of the applicant's passport
 - (3) One copy of the applicant's diploma or official credential of graduation from the highest school attended abroad, or from a school for foreign citizens located in the R.O.C., or from a bilingual secondary school located in the R.O.C., either in Chinese or an English translation, and a full official transcript from the same institution, also in Chinese or an English translation. The transcript must be signed and sealed by the Registrar of the school.
 - (4) A study plan written in Chinese or English.
 - (5) An affidavit for financial support indicating that the applicant has sufficient funds for study in the R.O.C.

(6) Other items as required by individual departments.

The aforesaid “foreign school” includes Taiwan schools located overseas and foreign schools for overseas Chinese. The aforesaid “diploma,” (excluding that issued by overseas Taiwan schools and foreign schools for overseas Chinese) shall be certified in accordance with “Ministry of Education Procedural Guidelines for Verification and Recognition of Foreign Educational Qualifications.”

Applicants may apply for only one department, graduate institute or non-degree course of study at a time.

Foreign students who have completed the courses applied for and desire to continue their education in Taiwan will follow the admission procedures for domestic students. Except that Foreign students having completed Bachelor’s Degree or above in Taiwan and intending to proceed to apply for Master’s Degree or above can offer applicant’s diploma or credential of graduation from a Taiwan university or college and do not need to hand in one copy of the applicant’s diploma or official credential of graduation from the highest school attended abroad. Those who had completed a Bachelor’s Degree or above in NCNU with a diploma and a full official transcript from NCNU do not need to hand in the copies of the applicant’s passport and the applicant’s diploma or an official credential of graduation from the highest school attended abroad, and a study plan written in Chinese or English. However individual departments can decide whether or not an applicant has to hand in recommendation letters.

8. Procedures:

- (1) After the Admissions Office receives the application, it shall verify that the applicant meets the requirements specified above and that all application materials are correct and present. Applicants will be notified of missing materials and may supply these materials during the admissions period. Applications that do not meet the requirements will be rejected. Applications will be returned but application fees are not refundable.
 - (2) The Admissions Office shall forward all applications that meet requirements to departments for preliminary review before May 15th.
 - (3) Departments and Institutes shall convene Department or Institute Committees to conduct preliminary reviews of all applications (and screening examinations if necessary), and determine acceptance lists. Acceptance lists shall be presented to the Admissions Section on or before June 15th for transmission to the Foreign Student Admissions Committee for a second review.
 - (4) The Foreign Student Admissions Committee shall meet on or before June 30th to determine the final acceptance lists.
 - (5) After approval of the list by the President, applicants listed on the final acceptance list shall be notified by the Registration Section to enroll. The Registration Section shall submit a list of all students on the final acceptance list who have enrolled on or before November 30, including their names, nationalities, year and department or institute admitted to, and will clearly state if the applicant has won a Taiwan scholarship or scholarships sponsored by the Ministry of Education, for submission to the Ministry of Education.
 - (6) Notices will be sent by the Admissions Office to applicants not accepted. Documents submitted and application fee will not otherwise be returned.
9. Students accepted under cultural cooperation agreements or academic exchange programs whose grades do not meet the requirements stipulated above in Article 6 may be accepted by the University on a special case by case basis, but the number of courses or credits they are allowed to take each semester may be reduced by the individual departments, depending on the student’s Chinese language ability.
10. The student shall show proof of medical and personal accident insurance or national health insurance at the time of registration. Students with no insurance shall pay an insurance fee upon registration, for enrollment in an insurance plan handled by the University.
If a foreign student admitted to NCNU, arrives after more than one-third of the first semester has passed, that student may not be enrolled that academic year. Graduate students, however,

may be allowed to enroll the second semester with the approval of the dean of their department or graduate school.

11. Non-degree students are not regarded as having official student status, and are limited to one-year of attendance. Non-degree status may be extended for a second year with the University's permission.
12. Non-degree students may take no more than ten credits per semester in an undergraduate program and no more than six credits per semester in a graduate program. After the drop-add period has ended non-degree students may not drop courses except when courses are canceled due to insufficient enrollment.
13. NCNU will issue credit certificates for non-degree students who duly complete courses with passing grades. Non-degree students who are later admitted as degree students may receive credits for previous coursework through course waivers.
14. Non-degree students shall adhere to the University's rules. In the case of serious violations, their status may be revoked. Once their status has been revoked, they may not further apply for admission as regular or non-degree students, and must leave the University by a set date. The University will report all such cases to the relevant offices and authorities.
15. Regulations for foreign student registration and tuition shall follow the same regulations as for domestic students.
16. Foreign students who have been dismissed from other colleges or universities in Taiwan are ineligible to apply to this university. Applicants who violate this regulation will have their admission nullified or student status revoked.
Foreign students involved with suspension, dismissal, or alteration and revocation of student status will be reported to National Police Agency of the Ministry of the Interior, Bureau of Consular Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Nantou County Police Bureau, and the Ministry of Education.
All of these regulations are applicable to the affairs of applications, by foreign students who want to transfer to NCNU, for admission, interview, evaluation, and relevance.
17. The affairs in relation to applications for admission, suspension, or alteration and revocation of student status shall be handled by the Division of Academic Affairs. Personal counseling, evaluation, and contact shall be handled by the Division of Student Affairs. Academic counseling, evaluation, and contact shall be handled by the departments they are affiliated with. Both the Division of Student Affairs and affiliated departments shall hold frequent counseling activities for foreign students.
18. Students shall follow the "Ministry of Education Regulations Governing Study by Foreign Students in the Republic of China" and related regulations issued by NCNU for any issue not covered by the above regulations.
19. The regulations herein are effective upon ratification by the University Academic Council and review by the Ministry of Education; likewise for all amendments.

National Chi Nan University Guidelines for International Student Scholarship Awards

February 15, 2006 244th Administrative Council adopted
February 27, 2007 288th Administrative Council adopted
November 5, 2008 303th Administrative Council adopted
July 15, 2009 319th Administrative Council adopted
June 23, 2010 339th Administrative Council adopted

- I To encourage the entrance of international students into National Chi Nan University (NCNU) and to reward outstanding international students at NCNU, “National Chi Nan University Guidelines for International Student Scholarship Awards” (short for “Guidelines” hereafter) is established in compliance with the 14th rule of “Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.”
- II Funds for the Guidelines come from special subsidies of the Ministry of Education or from the university’s student scholarship award funds.
- III The Guidelines apply to international students scheduled to enter or studying at this university with the qualifications listed below:
 - (I) students who meet the 4th rule of the “National Chi Nan University Entrance Regulations for International Students” or who come to take degrees according to the associated educational system cosigned by our university and foreign .
 - (II) school achievements of the applicants have to consort to the regulations listed below:
 1. Applicants for a bachelor’s degree must graduate from the original school with a GPA of 2.5(or its equivalence) or higher. Qualifications and whether to recommend the student or not are decided by the NCNU department the student applies for. Students who have been the undergraduates in NCNU must take at least twelve credit points for each semester of the last academic year, and both of the average scores of the two semesters in the last academic year must reach 70 or higher.
 2. Applicants for a master’s degree or doctoral degree must graduate from the original school with a GPA of 3.0(or its equivalence) or higher. Qualifications and whether to recommend the student or not are decided by the NCNU department the student applies for. Students who have been in the graduate schools in our university must make both of the average scores of the two semesters in the last academic year reach 75 or higher.
 3. Based upon this enrollment rule, departments may upgrade the qualification of scholarship applicant but not lower than this enrollment rule.
 4. If applicants do not meet the qualifications above due to exceptional circumstances, their departments may recommend their case to the International Communication Advancement Committee for consideration.
- IV The amount of the Scholarship and the number of persons designated:
 - (I) The amount of money for different ranks:
 1. Bachelor’s program: The maximum amount of scholarship award per person per month is NTD\$7,000. The scholarship affords twelve months a year and the maximum of four years.
 2. Master’s program: The maximum amount of scholarship award per person per month is NTD\$13,000. The scholarship affords twelve months a year and the maximum of two years.
 3. Doctoral program: The maximum amount of scholarship award per person per month is NTD\$23,000. The scholarship affords twelve months a year and the maximum of four years.
 - (II) The number of scholarships awarded depends on the budget of that very year. If funds for

the scholarship of that very year are exhausted, then no more applications will be accepted.

International students awarded the scholarship also get a general fee (not tuition) waiver for the entire academic year.

- V The students who schedule to enter our university should present the application for scholarship at the same time while the students apply for entrance admission of our school (from February 1st to April 30th every year). The students who have been studying in our university should present the application within the first week since the school begins in the first semester of the academic year. Prepare all the documents listed below while presenting applications:
- (I) application form
 - (II) the Chinese or English version transcripts of all the records in the original or graduating school (records of foreign schools should be recognized by the local Embassy of the Republic of China or Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office) or the original of school report for the last academic year, including first and second semester
 - (III) a letter of recommendation (if scheduling to enter our university, the student can use the same one as for the application of entrance admission)
 - (IV) other documents beneficial for examination (such different encouragement or research performances as extracurricular activities, proof of winning a prize in competition, presenting a paper in a seminar or publishing a paper on a journal, etc.; skip it if there's none)
- VI Examination principles:
- (I) Priority is given to applicants to or in the M.A. or Ph.D. programs.
 - (II) Applicants who present other documents beneficial for examination might gain discretionary bonus points.
 - (III) The International Communication Advancement Committee has jurisdiction over the list of students who gain the scholarship.
- VII Students awarded this scholarship are under obligation to accept assignments from the Office of Research and Development relating to promotion of international academic exchange, or serve as teaching, administration or research assistants in their departments/graduate institutes; the workload and duties are determined by the Office of Research and Development and individual departments/graduate institutes.
- VIII Other points for attention:
- (I) Students awarded the scholarship who are subsequently found to have provided false or fraudulent information would be disqualified for the award and must pay back the amount received.
 - (II) Graduation or dropping out terminates an awarded scholarship.
 - (III) Students awarded the scholarship stop receiving it when taking the semester off and must reapply when resuming school.
 - (IV) International students on Taiwanese Scholarships are not eligible for this scholarship.
 - (V) International students on this scholarship are not eligible for other NCNU student scholarships.
- IX The Guidelines are adopted by the Administrative Council and become effective after the President's approval after appraisal and ratification.
